1600 Battle of Sekigahara: Tokugawa victory insures that Japan isolates itself for 250 years 1603 to 1867 Tokugawa Shogunate 1853 Perry and his "black ships" open Japan 1868-69 Japanese Civil War (Boshin War) 1868 to 1912 Meiji Restoration 1879 Japan formally annexes the Ryukyu Kingdom (including Okinawa) 1894-95 Sino-Japanese War: Korea moved from Chinese to Japanese sphere of influence 1895 Assassination of Korean Queen Myeongseong (Queen Min) 1900 Boxer Rebellion: Colonial powers including Japan versus China 1902 to 1922 Anglo-Japanese Alliances 1904-05 Russo-Japanese War 1905 May 27-28 Battle of Tsushima Strait. Russian Baltic Fleet destroyed 1905 September 5th Treaty of Portsmouth signed in Kittery, Maine 1906 Theodore Roosevelt wins Nobel Peace Prize for the Treaty of Portsmouth 1910 Japan-Korea Annexation Treaty 1914 to 1918 Japan is allied with the Allies during World War I 1920 to 22 Japanese Intervention in the Russian Revolution with other Western powers 1921 to 1922. Washington Naval Conference 5:5:3 ratio of battleships: US: Great Britain: Japan 1931 September 18th Japan invades Manchuria 1932 Manchukuo, the puppet state of Japan in Manchuria, is established 1933 Japan leaves the League of Nations 1937 July 7th to September 9th 1945 2nd Sino-Japanese War. Start of WW II for Asians 1937 December 13th to end of January, 1938 Rape of Nanking 1939 May to November Battle of Khalkhin Gol (Nomonhan) in Mongolia. Russia defeats Japan. 1939 August 23rd German-Soviet Nonaggression (Molotov-Ribbentrop) Pact 1939 September 1st Germany invades Poland. Start of WW II for Europeans 1940 May Evacuation of British army from Dunkirk 1940 September Japan occupies northern French Indochina 1940 September 27th Japan signs Tripartite Pact with Italy and Germany 1941 April 13th Soviet-Japanese Neutrality Pact 1941 June 22nd Germany invades the Soviet Union 1941 July 21st, Japan occupies southern French Indochina 1941 July 26th, Britain and the United States place an oil embargo on Japan 1941 December 7th Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor 1941 December 10th Japanese aircraft sink the HMS Prince of Wales 1941 December Germany fails to take Moscow 1942 February 15th Surrender of Singapore to the Japanese 1942 February 27th-March 1st, the Allies lose the naval battles for the Java Sea 1942 March to the end of WW II: Japanese occupation of the Dutch East Indies 1942 April 18th, Doolittle Raid on Japan 1942 May 6th United States surrenders all its forces in the Philippines 1942 June 4th United States wins the Battle of Midway 1942 August Battle for Guadalcanal begins and continues until February of 1943 1942 November 8th, British-US invasion of French North Africa 1943 February 2nd Russians finally win the Battle of Stalingrad 1943 November 20-23rd, Battle of Tarawa 1944 June 6th D-Day invasion of Normandy by the Allies 1944 October 23-26th United States wins the Battle of Levte Gulf

1945 February 4th to February 11th Yalta Conference with Roosevelt, Churchill, and Stalin. 1945 Stalin agrees at Yalta that Russia attacks Japan three months after Germany surrenders 1945 February 19th to March 26th Battle of Iwo Jima

1945 April 1st to June 22nd United States wins the battle for Okinawa

1945 April 12th FDR dies

1945 May 7th Germany surrenders

1945 July 16th First atomic explosion near Alamogordo, New Mexico

1945 July 17th to August 2nd, Potsdam Conference with Truman, Churchill, Attlee, and Stalin 1945 July 26th Potsdam Declaration sets out the Allied terms for Japanese surrender

1945 August 6th Bombing of Hiroshima

1945 August 8th Russia declares war on Japan and attacks in Manchuria and Sakhalin Island

1945 August 9th Bombing of Nagasaki

1945 August 15th Japan surrenders

1945 September 2nd Japan formally surrenders aboard the USS Missouri in Tokyo Bay
